Founder Arutchelvar **Dr. N. Mahalingam**

Arutchelvar Dr. N Mahalingam is the Founder Chairman of Sakthi Group, an industrial conglomerate operating in sugar, automobiles, finance, power and logistics. Dr. N. Mahalingam was a philanthropist, educationalist and a statesman. He established a number of educational institutions and is known for his support to various spiritual and cultural organisations.

He was born on 21 March, 1923 in an agriculture family at Pollachi to P.Nachimuthu Gounder, who started the Sakthi Group in 1921 by diversifying his traditional business of hiring out bullock carts to starting passenger transport services. Nachimuthu Gounder's only son Dr. N.Mahalingam joined the business in 1943 and helped grow the business to its current level. He was the founder of many educational institutions, from schools to colleges. Some of his educational institutions are Nachimuthu Polytechnic College, NGM College, Kumaraguru College of Technology, Mahalingam College of Engineering, Kumaraguru Institute of Agriculture and in his vision, Kumaraguru College of Liberal Arts and Science was started in 2018.

He held several important positions and played major roles fostering the development of agricultural, industrial, human resource and institutional development at the State and National levels. He served as a Member of Legislative Assembly of Tamil Nadu from 1952 to 1967 and was on the Tamil Nadu State Planning Commission for two terms. His social and humanitarian considerations took his journey beyond the boundaries of industries and scholarly tenets he nurtured. He received the Padma Bhushan award from the Government of India in 2007 for his contributions to the nation in the field of Trade and Industry. His other honors include Honorary Consul from the Government of Mauritius during 1989 to 1992 and a number of other recognition and awards. The enigmatic life merged into the light on October 2, 2014, the birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi. Until the last moment, Dr. NM was doing what he believed in and envisioned talking about Saint Vallalar's philosophy. Throughout his life Dr. NM carried the twin torches of Gandhian values and Vallalar's way of life and his life is a pathway to lead a life of consciousness.

Named after Tamil poet Subramania Bharathiar, the university was established in February 1982 under the provision of Bharathiar University Act, 1981 (Act 1 of 1982) and was recognized by the University Grants Commission (UGC) in 1985. Bharathiar University is ranked 20 overall in India by National Institutional Ranking Framework of 2018 and 13 among universities.

KCLAS offers unique liberal arts education through which students think and learn across disciplines, literally liberating or freeing the mind to its fullest potential. Emotional: To address issues related to family, personal, health, self-awareness, and gender related.


Behavioral: To address behavior patterns that limit emotional well-being, such as peer issues, communication styles, and value-based conflicts.



Academic Information

5.1. Duration of the Course

The course shall extend over a period of three years comprising of six semesters with two semesters in one academic year. There shall not be less than 90 working days for each semester. Examination shall be conducted at the end of every semester.

Course of **Study**

The course of study for the UG degree courses of all branches shall consist of the following respective subjects.

Part -I

Tamil or any one of the following modern/classical languages i.e. Telugu, Kannada, Malayalam, Hindi, Sanskrit, French, German, Arabic & Urdu.

The subject shall be offered during the first four semesters with one examination at the end of each semester (4 courses – 12 credits). For paraprofessional branches it shall be offered for the first two semesters with one examination at the end of each semester (2 courses – 6 credits).

Part – II: English

The subject shall be offered during the first four semesters with one examination at the end of each semester (4 courses – 12 credits). For paraprofessional branches and courses there will be only two papers for the first two semesters with one examination at the end of each semester (2 courses – 6 credits).

During second semester part II English will be offered as communication skills.

Part - III Core subjects

- The programmes with 4 semester languages: 15 courses – 60 credits
- The programmes with 2 semester languages: 19 courses – 72 credits
- Allied Subjects (each course in I, II, III & IV semesters) 4 courses – 20 credits
- Project or electives with three courses are offered in the 5th and 6th semesters.
- For project 15 credits. For electives with 3 courses – 15 credits.

Part - IV

Tamil language of non-Tamil students, Yoga/ Human Excellence/skill-based courses/ environmental studies/ value education

Part - V

Extension Activities

6.1 Attendance requirement

- Students are required to attend all the classes.
- If leave is required, students are required to apply for the same through KITE.
- In case of medical leave, students must produce a doctor's certificate and a letter from the parents.
- A student will be permitted to appear for the CEE for any semester (practical/theory) if
- 1. He/she secures not less than 75% of attendance in the number of working days during the semester.
- 2. He/she earns a progress certificate from the head of the institution, of having satisfactorily completed the course of study prescribed in the subjects as required by these regulations, and
- 3. His/her conduct has been satisfactory.

A student who has secured less than 65% but 55% and above attendance in any semester has to compensate the shortage in attendance in the subsequent semester besides, earning the required percentage of attendance in that semester and appear for both semester papers together at the end of the latter semester.

A student who has secured less than 55% of attendance in any semester will not be permitted to appear for the regular examinations and to continue the study in the subsequent semester. He/she has to rejoin the semester in which the attendance is less than 55%.

A student who has secured less than 65% of attendance in the final semester has to compensate his/her attendance shortage in a manner as decided by the concerned head of the department after rejoining the same course.

6.2 Examinations

The policies and norms for examinations are governed by Bhartiar university. The assessments will include Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) and Comprehensive External Examination (CEE).

CIA will include tests, assignments, seminar, quizzes etc, which will be conducted throughout the Semester.

Students who secured 40% in CIA and 40% in CEE and minimum aggregate 40% in both shall be deemed to have passed the course in UG program.

Students who secured 50% in CIA and 50% in CEE and minimum aggregate 50% in both shall be deemed to have passed the course in PG program.

6.3 Award of Degree

- Students who have secured a minimum of 7.5 out of 10 CGPA, comprising of CIA and CEE shall be deemed to have passed in First Class with Distinction.
- Students who have secured a minimum of 6.0 out of 10 CGPA, comprising of CIA and CEE shall be deemed to have passed in First Class.
- Students who clear all courses in the first attempt shall be eligible for distinction and University rank.

6.4 Classroom policies and norms

- 1. Students should wear ID card when in classroom and in campus.
- 2. Students are expected to be polite, dignified and professional.
- 3. Should not use mobile phones to call/ text when during the lectures. However, students are encouraged to browse/ read for academic purpose as suggested by the faculty facilitating the class.
- 4. Students are expected to be seated in the lecture hall five minutes prior to the commencement of the class.
- 5. Students should maintain discipline inside the lecture hall / library/ lab. Chewing gum, inside the classroom is strictly prohibited.
- 6. Students will attend the lectures in allotted rooms and hence there will be movement between two lectures.
- 7. The students shall be regular and punctual in attending classes and all activities connected with the College.
- 8. The college timings are from 8.30 to 4.30 pm which includes KCLAS EDGE/Club which is mandatory for all students and students are required to be in classes during the working hours.
- 9. Fall in attendance will be communicated to parents as per the directives of TN Dept of education.
- 10. Students are required to bring their laptops for academic learning & work.
- 11. Students are required to apply for leave in the KITE for approval from the Class advisor.



- 12. If on medical leave, the medical certificate should be produced on the day of joining along with a leave letter signed by the parent.
- 13. Students are required to be present for all the programs/ events organized by KCLAS.

6.5 Academic Honesty

KCLAS upholds highest value and integrity in all the academic, co-academic work of the students and faculty. Being honest and ethical in presenting the work is an essential responsibility. Violation of academic honesty or assisting others in academic dishonesty will be viewed verry seriously and will result in academic loss. Academic dishonesty will include,

Cheating: Includes but not limited to Copying in exams/ others work, unauthorized access to materials inn exams, proxy test taking, someone else doing the assignment.

Fabrication: Includes but not limited to false data/information, false references/citations

Plagiarism: Includes but not limited to borrowing of ideas, opinions, examples, key words, phrases, sentences, paragraphs, or even structure from another person's work, including work written or produced by others without proper acknowledgment. The work includes in the form of essays, assignments, term papers, project reports, coursework, thesis and dissertation leading to the award of degrees, research papers, policy papers, chapters in books, full-fledged books and any other work.

The regulations as prescribed by UGC on Penalties in case of plagiarism in submission of thesis and dissertations may be followed.

Institutional Academic Integrity Panel (IAIP) shall impose penalty considering the severity of the Plagiarism.

Level 0: Similarities up to 10% - Minor Similarities, no penalty.

Level 1: Similarities above 10% to 40% - Such student shall be asked to

submit a revised script within a stipulated time period not exceeding 6 months.

Level 2: Similarities above 40% to 60% - Such student shall be debarred from submitting a revised script for a period of one year.

Level 3: Similarities above 60% -Such student registration for that programme shall be cancelled.

A mechanism be created so as to ensure that each of the paper publication / thesis / dissertation by the student, faculty, researcher or staff of the University / affiliated college is checked for plagiarism at the time of forwarding / submission.



Diploma in Liberal Arts

Students will be given platform to gain liberal arts education through taught courses and variety of field experiential learning. Students are given choices to broaden their exposure through a variety of learning opportunities.

Liberal Arts Certificate

Diploma in Liberal Arts will be offered by Sakthi Excellence Academy (SEA) and KCLAS along with the degree offered by Bharathiar University.

Students can earn liberal arts certificate from KCLAS if they earn a minimum of 25 credits at the end of 3 years of their undergraduate program.

KCLAS Liberal Arts Certificate = 25 - 32 Credits KCLAS Liberal Arts Certificate with Distinction >= 33 Credits

Liberal Edge - Campus Courses

All students of KCLAS have an opportunity to learn inter-disciplinary courses in addition to the courses in their domain in four semesters. 





9.1. Campus Rules

- Students are expected to communicate respectfully and behave with decorum towards faculty members and staff of the College.
- Leaving the classroom during class hours is not permitted. Students should refrain from leaving or entering late, except for genuine emergencies.
- Students are responsible for reading emails, notices, and circulars displayed on the College Notice Board. Ignorance of posted information will not be considered an excuse for non-compliance.
- All vehicles must be parked in designated areas. Unauthorized parking will result in vehicle impoundment.
- During College functions, students are expected to conduct themselves in a manner that reflects positively on themselves and the institution.
- Spitting, smoking, chewing gum, and littering are strictly prohibited within the college campus.
- Any damage to College property will result in collective responsibility for the cost of repairs, if individual responsibility cannot be determined.
- Complaints and grievances should be addressed individually to the respective Head of Department (HoD).
- Meetings or functions may not be held on College premises without prior written permission from the principal.
- Circulating notices or displaying information on notice boards without written
 permission from the principal is prohibited. Similarly, no information or
 reports should be shared with the press or broadcasting agencies without
 prior approval from the principal.
- Misconduct during examinations, submission of false information or documents for admission, and failure to return borrowed materials or settle debts will be dealt with severely.
- Due to the simultaneous conduct of various courses on campus, students are expected to maintain a quiet environment.
- Ragging, drug usage, and eve-teasing are considered criminal offenses and are strictly prohibited by law, with penalties including up to 7 years of imprisonment.

9.2 Wearing of ID Cards

Each student will be issued an identity card at the beginning of their course.
 The ID card serves as proof of current enrollment in the institution and grants access to campus facilities. Day-scholar and hostel rules also apply to the use of ID cards.

Guidelines for use of ID Card

- It is mandatory to wear the ID card at all times while on campus, at
 institution-sponsored events, or when representing the college at events
 outside campus and common places such as seminar halls, the library, and
 the auditorium.
- Any faculty member of the institution has the authority to ask a student to show their ID card at any time while on campus.
- It is mandatory to show the ID card if requested by any security official at the check post or parking area.
- The ID card is the student's responsibility. If the ID card is lost, damaged, or broken, the student is responsible.
- If any details on the ID card are not visibly clear, the student must re-apply for and use a new ID card

Re-applying for Lost ID Card

- If a student loses their ID card, they must write a letter explaining the reason to their class advisor.
- The class advisor will forward the letter to the Head of the Office of Student Affairs (OSA).
- The cost of reprinting the ID card will be deducted from the caution deposit paid by the student.

Money on ID Card

- Your ID card can hold money for purchasing items from the store (stationery) depot.
- If you need more money on your ID card, you can top it up by visiting the finance department in the admin block.

9.3 Dress code

- Working Hours: Boys must wear formal trousers, shirts, and shoes.
- Non-Working Hours: Boys are allowed to wear polo t-shirts and jeans.
- Girls must wear salwar's/churidars while on campus.
- All students must wear their ID cards while on campus.

9.4 Vehicle Parking

- Students are allowed to bring their vehicles to campus.
- To get vehicle parking permission, students must obtain a parking sticker from the Chief Security Officer (CSO).

- The following documents must be submitted to the Student Center Support Services:
- A letter requesting vehicle parking permission.
- A photocopy of the vehicle's Registration Certificate (RC) book.
- A photocopy of the student's driving license.
- Upon submission of these documents, the CSO will issue an entry clearance sticker.
- The entry clearance sticker must be placed in a prominent location on the vehicle to ensure visibility to gate security officials.
- Students must show their ID cards upon request at the gate.
- If the sticker is damaged, students must reapply for a new one by contacting the CSO.
- Vehicles must be parked only in the designated parking area. Non-compliance with parking rules will result in the vehicle being denied campus entry.
- The management will not be responsible for any damage caused to vehicles parked on campus.

9.5 Use of Campus Resources

Institution resources must be reserved for business purposes on behalf of the Institution. They may not be used for personal gain except in a manner that is incidental and reasonable in light of the person's duties. Institution resources include, but are not limited to:

- Use of Institution systems: Such as telephone systems, data communication and networking systems, and the domain for electronic communication forums.
- Use of Institution equipment: Any equipment provided by the Institution.
- Use of procurement tools: Such as purchasing cards, credit cards, and petty cash.
- Time and effort of other staff, students, and others at the Institution.

Appropriate use of Institution property and information requires that persons not use a password, access a file, or retrieve any stored communication without authorization. This includes:

- Concealing, falsifying, altering, misusing, or removing records, including electronic records
- Sharing information such as mailing lists of students, employees, or alumni
 without authorization from the Unit Executive.

Any member of the K-Community using Institution resources may not solicit others for commercial ventures, religious or political causes, outside organizations, or other non-Institution matters

9.6 General Behavior

All members of the K-Community are responsible for upholding the highest ethical standards of the institute and the broader communities in which it functions by adhering to the code of conduct. The institute values honesty, trust, fairness, respect, and responsibility and strives to integrate these values into its teaching, research, and business practices. The intent of the Code of Conduct is to maintain ethics, protect academic freedom, foster a collegial atmosphere for teaching and scholarship, and advance the mission of the institution.

The Student Code of Conduct promotes honesty, integrity, accountability, and the rights and responsibilities associated with being a constructive member of the K-Community.

9.7 ICC Policy

- KCLAS will not tolerate sexual harassment under any circumstances. Responsibility lies with every member of the K-Community to ensure that sexual harassment does not occur.
- This policy applies to conduct that takes place in any institution-related context, including conferences, work functions, social events, and business trips.
- No employee or volunteer at any level should subject any other employee, volunteer, customer, or visitor to any form of sexual harassment.
- A breach of this policy will result in disciplinary action, up to and including termination of work/study with KCLAS.
- KCLAS strongly encourages any employee who feels they have been sexually harassed to take immediate action. If an employee or volunteer feels comfortable in doing so, it is preferable to raise the issue directly with the person involved, with a view to resolving the issue through discussion. The employee or volunteer should identify the harassing behavior, explain that the behavior is unwelcome and offensive, and ask that the behavior stops.
- Alternatively, or in addition, they may report the behavior in accordance with the relevant procedure. Once a report is made, the organization has the right to determine how the report should be dealt with in accordance with its obligations and this policy.
- Any reports of sexual harassment will be treated seriously and promptly with sensitivity. Such reports will be treated as completely confidential up to the point where a formal or informal complaint is lodged against a particular person, at which point that person must be notified under the rules of natural justice.
- Complainants have the right to determine how to have a complaint treated, to have support or representation throughout the process, and the option to discontinue a complaint at any stage of the process.
- The alleged harasser also has the right to have support or representation during any investigation, as well as the right to respond fully to any formal allegations made. There will be no presumptions of guilt and no determination made until a full investigation has been completed.

 No employee or volunteer will be treated unfairly as a result of rejecting unwanted advances. Disciplinary action may be taken against anyone who victimizes or retaliates against a person who has complained of sexual harassment, or against any employee or volunteer who has been alleged to be a harasser.

9.8 Institutional Rules Abuse

Dishonest Behavior

All forms of dishonesty, including cheating, plagiarism, and supplying false information, as well as forgery or use of documents or instruments of identification with intent to mislead or defraud, are prohibited.

Disruptive Behavior

Engaging in, or inciting others to engage in, conduct which disturbs the peace of the institute, involves a significant disruption of institute activity, or impedes the reasonable freedom of expression or movement of other members of the K-Community or its quests is prohibited.

Reckless Driving

Driving or parking on campus sidewalks or in prohibited areas is not allowed. Students must park their vehicles only in the designated student parking areas.

Fireworks

The possession or use of fireworks is prohibited on campus.

Unauthorized Entry

Unauthorized entry, use, or occupation of the institution's facilities, as well as the unauthorized possession, duplication, or use of keys to any institution facility, is prohibited.

Off-Campus Incidents

Incidents and violations that occur outside the residence halls, including off-campus, are referred directly to the head of the student center.

9.9 Substance Abuse

Alcohol and Other Drugs Use

Dry Institution Policy: KCLAS is a dry institution. The possession, consumption, being under the influence of, or providing beverages containing alcohol, as well as the possession of alcoholic beverage containers, either full or empty, on property owned or supervised by the institution is prohibited. Disruptive or disrespectful behavior, property damage, or personal harassment as a consequence of alcohol consumption is also prohibited. Any person, regardless of age, found in violation of the alcohol policy is subject to KCLAS' disciplinary system.

Illicit Drugs Policy: The possession, use, sale, manufacturing, or distribution of illicit drugs and/or drug paraphernalia is a violation of the law and is prohibited. Disruptive or disrespectful behavior, property damage, or personal harassment as a consequence of illicit drugs or controlled substances is strictly prohibited. Any person found in violation of this policy will be subject to the institution's disciplinary system, which could include suspension or dismissal and may be reported to the appropriate local or state authorities.

Holistic Support: The institution, historically, has aimed to positively influence the whole person—mind, body, and spirit. Consistent with that goal, KCLAS supports definitive actions designed to assist students and employees striving to cope with problems related to the use of alcohol and drugs.

Tobacco

Tobacco use is discouraged as a basic principle of good health. The University will not tolerate smoking to the extent that it inconveniences non-smokers. Smoking, including e-cigarettes and vaping, as well as the use of smokeless tobacco and hookahs, is not permitted in any of the buildings owned or used by the institution.

9.10 People Abuse

Hazing

Hazing means any intentional, knowing, or reckless act occurring on or off campus. No individual of the K-Community will be allowed to perform acts of hazing.

The term includes but is not limited to:

- Any type of physical brutality, such as whipping, beating, striking, branding, electronic shocking, placing of a harmful substance on the body, or similar activity.
- Any type of physical activity, such as sleep deprivation, exposure to the elements, confinement in a small space, calisthenics, or other activity that subjects the student to an unreasonable risk of harm or that adversely affects the mental or physical health or safety of the student.
- Any activity involving consumption of food, liquid, alcoholic beverages, liquor, drugs, or other substances that subjects the student to an unreasonable risk of harm or which adversely affects the mental or physical health or safety of the student.
- Any activity that intimidates or threatens the student with ostracism, subjects the student to extreme mental stress, shame, or humiliation, or adversely affects the mental health or dignity of the student, discourages the student from entering or remaining registered in an educational institution, or may reasonably be expected to cause a student to leave the organization or the institution rather than submit to acts described in this subsection.
- Any activity that induces, causes, or requires the student to perform a duty or task which involves a violation of the Penal Code.

A person commits an offense if they:

- Engage in hazing.
- Solicit, encourage, direct, aid, or attempt to aid another in engaging in hazing.
- Intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly permit hazing to occur.
- Have firsthand knowledge of the planning of a specific hazing incident involving a student in an educational institution, or firsthand knowledge that a specific hazing incident has occurred, and knowingly fail to report said knowledge to the Office of Student Affairs or another appropriate official of the institution.

- An organization commits an offense if it condones or encourages hazing or if an officer
 or any combination of members, pledges, or alumni of the organization commit or
 assist in the commission of hazing.
- The act of hazing is not consistent with the mission or philosophy of the institute and will not be accepted as appropriate behavior. Students and/or student organizations who commit a hazing incident will face disciplinary action according to the discipline system.

Discrimination

- Any member of the institution should not discriminate against others based on race, age, sex, color, religion, ability or disability, national origin, sexual orientation, gender, ethnicity, family or marital status, or any other characteristic protected by law.
- The institution is committed to equal opportunity and does not unlawfully discriminate
 in the recruitment or treatment of applicants, employment opportunities, or general
 employment practices. This commitment applies to all members of the K-Community.

9.11 Property Misuse and Theft

Fire Extinguishers

• It is strictly prohibited to misuse or tamper with fire-fighting equipment or safety apparatus on campus. Fire extinguishers within the premises contain a chemical dry powder. Discharging them without a genuine emergency not only incurs significant cleaning expenses but also poses severe risks. The discharged powder can cause blindness and skin burns. Any individual found negligently causing harm to another person by playing with or discharging a fire extinguisher will be held directly responsible for any resulting material damages and personal injuries, whether to themselves or others.

Theft

Acts of theft or vandalism against the property of another individual or the institute
are strictly forbidden. This includes the receipt, retention, or disposal of lost or mislaid
property belonging to another person or the institute. Students who come across
potentially lost items are required to return them to the student center.

Technology Misuse

- Protection of Intellectual Property Rights (IPR)
- The institution adheres to all laws governing intellectual property rights, encompassing copyright infringement, safeguarding confidential information, and respecting software privacy. 10.2 General rules

- The hostel shall be treated as an extension of the Institution and observance of rules and regulations of the Hostel shall be compulsory for all residents.
- Students shall take prior written permission of the Principal/Head Hostel before giving any information or interview regarding Hostel to any member of the Press, Radio, Television or any other media or before making any speech containing any information regarding the Hostel.
- Students residing in the hostel will be staying at their own risk, liability and consequences.
- Students should produce their identity cards on demand.
- Students using computers are not permitted to use multimedia speakers.
 Violation of this will be viewed seriously. Only ear hags can be used in the rooms to respect the privacy of other roommates
- Students shall treat the staff and housekeeping staff of the Hostel with due courtesy at all times. Service of the housekeeping staff shall not be utilized for private or personal work.
- Members shall not give any tips to service personals or cooks of the hostel and shall not demand any special service from any hostel employee.
- Students should not involve in business, collection of funds, compelling others to join in some organization as a member etc.
- No gambling of any kind shall be allowed on the premises of the hostel.
- The students of the hostel are not allowed to stay in the hostel during the college working hours. In case if they have to stay, they should apply for leave as per college rules informing the Care Taker/SWO the reasons for staying in the hostel during working hours.
- The Hostel administration can cancel hostel admission without stating any reason at any time on disciplinary grounds, in which case, the student may even be required to vacate the room at short notice.
- Students may also be required to shift to alternate accommodation at short notice due to administrative reasons.
- Pets of all kinds are prohibited inside the hostel. Feeding stray dogs or cats in the hostel premises is not permitted.
- Any damage/breakage to hostel property will be charged to the occupants of the room/ block with a fine. Disciplinary action will also be initiated.
- Cooking in hostel rooms is not permitted. Possession of cooking material, induction tops, stoves, heaters etc. will invite heavy penalty and repeated offence may amount to expulsion from the hostels.
- All instructions/ notices communicated by e-mails and displayed on notice boards in the hostels will be deemed to have been read by all residents and excuses for non-compliance of rules and instructions put up from time to time will not be accepted.

- Playing of loud music or disturbing fellow hostel inmates will not be permitted.
- Playing outdoor games inside the hostels/corridors is not permitted.
- Silence Hours will be observed from 10 p.m. to 06 a.m. on all days. No noise
 of any sort will be permitted during the Silence Hours. Serious action will be
 taken on the breach of this rule.
- Any manner of festivities/ celebrations/ Partying in the rooms/corridors
 or anywhere in the hostel will not be permitted whatever be the occasion.
 Residents must not go to another's room and disturb the inmates. Complaints
 from other residents will be investigated and action taken accordingly.
- Students shall not bring, take and/or drink any alcohol/ intoxicating drink, drug or substance of any kind what so ever and/or smoke in the room and/or any part of premises. The same shall apply to visitors also. An occurrence of such behaviour shall invite strict disciplinary action leading to rustication from the Institute.
- All hostel inmates must report any disciplinary matter or problems concerning them or their room-mate/neighbour(s) coming to their notice to the SWO/ Chief Warden through block caretaker or directly. In case their room-mate is absent from the room or is sick / admitted in the hospital or is in any kind of physical/mental trouble or is indulging in any bad practices the same must be immediately brought to the notice of the SWO or the Chief Warden.
- Giving the room keys to any person other than the Caretakers/ SWO, in good faith is at their own risk. The residents must lock the rooms with their own locks.
- Students are not permitted to bring vehicles inside the hostel campus.
- Students who wish to attend classes outside KCT daily or regularly should get a permission letter approved by Head-Hostels through Chief Warden and the same to be submitted to the SWO.
- For valid reasons and with mutual consent of hostel inmate, the allotted room can be changed. A request letter has to be submitted to Head-Hostel through Chief Warden and SWO.
- Use of bad and abusive language should be avoided within the hostel premises.
- Students should not indulge in any illegal and/or unethical activity on the hostel premises.
- If you are facing any difficulty adjusting with your roommate and unable to resolve the issue, it must be reported to the administration immediately. Students are expected to act with maturity and not involve their parents or guardians, in trivial cases.

- The management reserves the right to break open the rooms in case of violations of hostel rules, suspected unlawful activities and security risk cases or where the student is absent from his room for a long period without prior information or any valid reason.
- Suggestions and complaints should be either deposited in the "Suggestion Box" or should be entered in the "Suggestion Register" kept in the hostel premises. Suggestion form is also available in the Hostel.
- All E-mail Communication regarding hostel will be sent to the official e-mail IDs of students.
- Parcels /Letters addressed to hostel can be collected in SWO's office.

Misconduct or infringements of rules and regulations and activities which are not in the interest of the institution and harmful to the reputation of the institution will make a student liable for severe disciplinary action and even expulsion from the hostel.

10.3 Hostel Timings

- Hostel timings will be strictly adhered to.
- All residents will return to the hostel by 07:00 PM (Girls) and 09:00 PM (Bovs). At 07:00 PM / 09:00 PM hostel gates will be closed.
- Hostel residents will not be allowed to go out of the hostel after 07:00 PM for girls and 09:00 PM for boys or enter after the above mentioned time unless they have prior approval of the hostel authorities.
- Maximum entry time into girls hostel with special permission for academic/club activities will be till 11:00 PM
- Evening library timings for hostel residents are up to 11:00 PM.
- For airls: Slot 1: 06:00 PM to 08:00 PM. Slot 2: 09:00 PM to 11:00 PM Students have to wait near the ladies' hostel security gate around 06:00 PM / 09:00 PM. Girls will be accompanied by RTs/CTs to the library.
- For Boys: Permitted up to 11:00 PM.
- Any student found loitering on the campus after 11:00 PM can be questioned by the Security staff. They are liable to surrender their ID card to security staff on duty.

10.4 Visitors Policy

- Parents/Guardians should give an undertaking to cooperate with the Hostel authorities and should be available on call as and when required and disclose all contact details.
- Parents/Visitors are advised to meet their wards in the visiting room.
- Parents may visit the hostels from 06:00 AM to 08:00 AM and 05:00 PM to 07:00 PM on working days and between 09:00 AM to 07:00 PM on Sundays and public holidays.

- Hostel is out of bounds for day-scholars/visitors.
- Movement of inmates from one hostel block to another is not permitted without valid permission

General rules

- 1. Students shall adhere to the dining timings. Mess will be closed and no student will be allowed entry after the prescribed time.
- 2. The students shall not entertain day- scholars and visitors into the Hostel mess.
- 3. Unauthorized entry of day scholars, visitors will result punishment including fine to both the day scholar and the resident of the hostel.
- 4. Students should not enter the kitchen without prior permission of the Mess Manager.
- 5. Carrying of utensils (plate, glass, spoons, etc.) is prohibited from the Dining. It is only allowed to sick residents with written permission by the warden and such persons should be responsible for bringing back the same.
- 6. Students should wash their plates and deposit the washed plates in the earmarked holders.
- 7. Students shall dump the wastes in the bins which are provided for collection of the litter, fruit peels etc.
- 8. Students should not waste food.
- 9. Students who bring their own laptops & other valuables are solely responsible for its safety.
- 10. Students should be dressed decently when they enter into the dining halls.



Tuition FeePayment Policy

All students will be required to pay annual fee for the program of study at KCLAS. The tuition fee includes lectures, workshops, Expert sessions, practical, project supervisorship, interrnal assessments, KCLAS Edge, services offered through student clubs, stores, and forums and use of general campus facilities, labs and equipment throughout the year.

- Payment Period: Tuition fee payment shall be paid for each academic year as stipulated by the Institution.
- 2. Payment Method: Tuition fee shall be paid only through the official on-line portal of Kumaraguru Institutions.
- **3.** Payment Time-line: Tuition fee shall be paid within 15 days of the commencement of the academic year.
- 4. Sanctions for non-payment of fees: Should students fail to make the tuition fee payment before the deadline, they will not be permitted for Internal/ Practical/ end semester exams.

5. Other fee

- a. Students using transport or residential facilities will pay prescribed fee at the commencement of academic year as per the rules of Kumaraguru Institutions. Failure to pay will lead to discontinuance of services of hostel/transport.
- b. All students will be required to pay the exam fee as per the norms of the University one month before the commencement of exams through the Kumaraguru Fee portal. Failure to pay will lead to non-receipt of hall ticket from the University.
